In the Gospels, the picture painted of the disciples of Jesus is not that flattering. Time and again they either fail to understand the mission and purpose of Jesus or they flee in fear and despair, especially as Good Friday approaches.

What a difference the resurrection makes! In the book of Acts, thes same disciples who have experienced Easter and the power of the Spirit are transformed into faithful followers who are both fearless and focused!

Easter and resurrection are indeed about the defeat of death & fear by faith & hope. They are also about "transformation".

The disciples were transformed and it is our Easter task as well - both personally and socially as church and world.

Death and resurrection are a pattern in life. We see this all around us. We see this in the annual change of seasons from winter to spring. Sometimes it takes pain for new birth to occur. Sometimes in order for new things to be born, other things must die. Transformation isn't always easy.

At Woodlawn, we have been in the midst of change and transformation for a while now and we have a little ways still to go. Death AND resurrection continue...

- A joint needs assessment process beginning that will help us focus or visions and dreams for the near future. What new things does God have in store for us at this particular time in our history?
- Our building was transformed with the new extension and that loan for the Accessibility project is being paid down quickly thanks to the hard work and sacrifice of the congregation and Friends of Accessibility. What's the next project? Is it physical or spiritual? Where is God leading us in our stewardship of time talent and treasure?
